What is the UNM Daniels Fund College Readiness Program

The University of New Mexico – Daniels College Prep Program begins with a parent/student orientation during the 2008 spring semester of a student's junior year in high school, extending into the summer for a six-day residential program, and concluding with a series of senior seminars during the student's senior year of high school.

The seminars are designed to help promising young adults with demonstrated financial need to prepare for college, explore college possibilities, and understand the college application process. By making the college application process understandable and financial application process accessible, this program is piloted with an emphasis on earning a college degree. Orientation, the summer residential program, and seminars are held on the UNM main campus.

How is the Program Structured?

The Program involves classes on SAT prep, college applications, and scholarships, as well as community service.

How do I apply?

Who can attend?

The UNM Daniels College Readiness Program is a financially need based program. However, students' past academic performance and/or proven academic potential will be taken into consideration for the selection process. Rather than focusing exclusively on past academic success, the UNM Daniels College Prep Program seeks to invest in students who demonstrate:

- Financial need (Pell Grant eligibility);
- Academic performance or promise;
- Strength of character, evidence of leadership potential, and emotional maturity and stability;
- Well-rounded personality, abilities, and broad interests; and
- The potential to contribute to one's community later in life.
